June 17: Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Readings: Ex17:22-24, 2 Cor 5:5-10, Mk 4:26-34

Today's gospel compares the Kingdom of God to a small mustard seed that grows into a plant with large branches so that even the birds can dwell in its shade. Compare that to the first reading where Ezekiel speaks of a tender shoot growing into a tall cedar. At every Mass we pray "thy kingdom come". How do you envision that kingdom? Whether we imagine it to be like a majestic cedar or a large bush: both take patience and time to grow. Both take good soil as a foundation. And we cannot make it grow. We can only plant the seeds and shoots and provide the water and care. Can we cultivate the grace that God has given us, cultivate that gift of faith within us to so that it will overflow and others who live in the shade of our faith will come to be open to the gifts of God?

"Walking by Faith and Not by Sight"

"Sometimes God does things we can't understand. This is where our need to walk by faith and not by sight comes in play. They could have been easily overlooked, forgotten, ignored, but instead they sprouted into among the most revered in our history. This is a lesson of not giving up. Catholic Book Review

"Blessed are the Bored in Spirit: A Young Catholic's Search for Meaning" by Mark Hart

This is a fantastic book for older teens, young adults and parents! If you ever feel like you are just checking off a to-do box when going to Church or preparing for the Sacraments, this book is for you! God want to transform us, make us into a new creation, love us despite our messes. There is so much more to our faith than the rules we all know by heart. If you ever wondered what faith is really for, how you can be spiritual AND religious, what discipleship and a relationship with Jesus is all about, this book is for you!

Mark Hart uses stories from his own life and faith, failures and successes to illustrate the Truths of our Faith. He offers practical steps we can take to draw closer to Jesus and to enter onto the path to sainthood. We are all called to holiness, and not a pious, plaster-cast statue type holiness, but real, flesh and blood transformed in the Spirit, holiness. He shows us, with his characteristic sense of humor, the three things – our perspective, our approach and our self-offering - need to be transformed in order to be open to the encounter with Christ.

This would be a terrific book for anyone who works with teens, for catechists who may need a shot in the arm, for parents who want their kids to remain faithful Catholics, but aren't sure how to explain the faith, and for older teens and young adults who are wondering about the meaning of life and the why of faith and church.

Note for parents of younger teens: I would recommend reading it first. There is a chapter dealing with issues relating to sex and other related themes.

TABERNACLE: Place in the Church where the Eucharist (Body of Christ) is reserved.

MONSTRANCE: This is the beautiful, ornate holder for the Body of Christ used during Exposition of the Holy Eucharist, and Benediction.

AMBO: The place where Scriptures/Readings and Gospel are proclaimed.

ALB: The white garment covering one's street clothes.

LECTIONARY: The book that contains all the readings from the Scriptures for use in the Liturgy (Mass).

SACRAMENTARY: The book used by the Priest/Celebrant containing all the prayers for the Liturgy of the Mass.
