Is 49:1-6, Acts 13:22-26, Lk 1:57-66, 80

His name shall be John. In naming their newborn son, Elizabeth and Zechariah break with tradition of naming their child after a relative. St. John the Baptist and the Birth of a New Era

"The birth of a child always represents both an end and a beginning. For the child, it is the end of the narrow world of the mother's womb and the beginning of all the possibilities that will lead from infancy to childhood, and then finally to adulthood. For parents, the new life of the child means new possibilities, but it also means an end to the former status quo — old patterns and behaviors will have to be renegotiated, even abandoned. The story of the birth of John the Baptist has this dynamism, but the richness of the tale is much more than that of a domestic story of a child being born. It is the story of the birth of not only a child, but a birth of a whole new world and the end of an old one.

With the birth of John the Baptist, the first rays of the dawn of redemption break upon the world. For in his light we see the One who will be all Light — Jesus the Lord. The coming of Christ into the world will mean that the old world of sin and death has come to an end and the new world of grace and mercy has begun. So you see, as John is born, more is born into the world than just a baby, as today's Gospel makes clear. John will be the one who lets us know that God has come into our world in Christ and the promises of salvation to Israel are now fulfilled. May we recognize this great revelation and stop living as if the old world of sin and death is our greatest truth — it is not!

Instead, Jesus has given us new possibilities — beyond the fear, anxiety, and regret; beyond the anger, hate, and scapegoating. Let us seek in the here and now of our lives the grace and mercy of the new world that Jesus has given to us — and in imitation of St. John the Baptist, invite others to share in this promise." -Fr. Steve Grunow at Word On Fire

Catechism Corner: "Words to Know"

GRACE: A *free* gift from God to human beings. Grace is a created sharing in the life of God. It is given through the merits of Christ and is shared by the Holy Spirit. We receive grace in a special way when we receive the Sacraments.

EPICLESIS: Is the intercession in which the Priest begs the Father to send the Holy Spirit so that the offerings of bread and wine become the body and blood of Christ. When we receive them, we become a living offering to God. This happens as part of the Consecration and can only be done by a Priest. Listen for the words: '...that they may become the Body and Blood...'

There is a name for the vessel used for sprinkling holy water. **ASPERGILLUM.** When we are sprinkled we are called to remember our own Baptism. We acknowledge this by making the Sign of the Cross. Every team has their own symbol so the world knows what team they are on. Catholics have the Sign of the Cross!
